The Future Watermelon Farm Leaders (FWFL) program recognizes the next generation of growers and packers who will lead the industry (and this Association) into the future. They do (and will) represent the generation that will meet the demands of a growing global population, sustain family farms and provide the nutritious food to the world.

The class of inductees will be eligible for the following:

- ✓ Invitation to the next National Watermelon Association convention.
  - Complimentary registration at the convention
  - Stipend of \$1,000 to help cover hotel and travel costs to convention.
- ✓ Induction into the next Class of Future Watermelon Farm Leaders.
- ✓ Opportunity at convention to be a presenter, greeter or other volunteer efforts.
- ✓ Invitation to be a guest at both of the following year's leadership meetings.
  - Learn first-hand the issues of the day in Washington, in the industry and what the Association is addressing on our members' behalf.

As a recognized Future Watermelon Farm Leader, you will:

- ✓ Build relationships with other watermelon association and industry leaders.
- ✓ Develop interpersonal relationship and communication skills.
- ✓ Be prepared to take leadership roles in the Association, Industry and your community.
- ✓ Gain an understanding of current political, scientific and economic issues facing the watermelon industry, as well as how we can collectively create positive change.
- ✓ Learn how the supply chain can work together to provide a safe, sustainable and profitable crop.

## **APPLICATIONS PROCESS**

The application process is open to National Watermelon Association members, their family members and/or their employees.

- ✓ Age of candidates: 39 years of age (or under) by FEB 1<sup>st</sup> of the upcoming convention.
- ✓ Any farmer or packer who receives at least half of his/her income from farming, packing or a direct farm-related business.
- ✓ Related member of a current NWA member's family or their company.
- ✓ The completed entry must be received at the NWA offices by December 15<sup>th</sup>.
- ✓ A class of two to three will be selected each year for induction.

The future of watermelon farming, and of the National Watermelon Association, will be in the hands of young farmers and packers soon. We encourage future leaders to apply for this program. While you experience opportunities that this program will offer, you will begin to build the future of the Association while continuing the respected trade of watermelon farming.
